## Discussion and vote pertaining to the sale of bonds - John Adams, Finance Director

Mr. Adams provided a brief explanation to the Board and reaffirming the Town's AAA Standard & Poor Bond Rating (which is the best rating) because we very strongly meet all the criteria to be awarded a AAA rating.

Mr. McGee, as clerk, read into the record the Vote of the Board of Selectmen in its entirety as follows:

I, the Clerk of the Board of Selectmen of the Town of Duxbury, Massachusetts (the "Town"), certify that at a meeting of the board held April 4, 2022, of which meeting all members of the board were duly notified and at which a quorum was present, the following votes were unanimously passed, all of which appear upon the official record of the board in my custody:

<u>Further Voted</u>: that in connection with the marketing and sale of the Bonds, the preparation and distribution of a Notice of Sale and Preliminary Official Statement dated March 21, 2022, and a final Official Statement dated March 28, 2022 (the "Official Statement"), each in such form as may be approved by the Town Treasurer, be and hereby are ratified, confirmed, approved and adopted.

<u>Further Voted</u>: that the Bonds shall be subject to redemption, at the option of the Town, upon such terms and conditions as are set forth in the Official Statement.

<u>Further Voted</u>: that the Town Treasurer and the Board of Selectmen be, and hereby are, authorized to execute and deliver a continuing disclosure undertaking in compliance with SEC Rule 15c2-12 in such form as may be approved by bond counsel to the Town, which undertaking shall be incorporated by reference in the Bonds for the benefit of the holders of the Bonds from time to time.

<u>Further Voted</u>: that we authorize and direct the Town Treasurer to establish post issuance federal tax compliance procedures and continuing disclosure procedures in such forms as the Town Treasurer and bond counsel deem sufficient, or if such procedures are currently in place, to review and update said procedures, in order to monitor and maintain the tax-exempt status of the Series A Bonds and to comply with relevant securities laws.

<u>Further Voted</u>: that any certificates or documents relating to the Bonds (collectively, the "Documents"), may be executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be regarded as an original and all of which shall constitute one and the same document; delivery of an executed counterpart of a signature page to a Document by electronic mail in a ".pdf" file or by other electronic transmission shall be as effective as delivery of a manually executed counterpart signature page to such Document; and electronic signatures on any of the Documents shall be deemed original signatures for the purposes of the Documents and all matters relating thereto, having the same legal effect as original signatures.

<u>Further Voted</u>: that each member of the Board of Selectmen, the Town Clerk and the Town Treasurer be and hereby are, authorized to take any and all such actions, and execute and deliver such certificates, receipts or other documents as may be determined by them, or any of them, to be necessary or convenient to carry into effect the provisions of the foregoing votes.

## Discussion regarding Uniqueness of Duxbury Beach

Mr. Read read the following memo into the record regarding the reason for the finding of uniqueness:

Dear Members,

As you may recall from previous years, in accordance with Massachusetts Procurement Law, specifically, M.G.L. c. 30B, sec. 16(e)(2), a governmental body is required to solicit proposals prior to acquiring by purchase or rental real property or an interest therein from any person at a cost exceeding twenty-five thousand dollars.

Further, the governmental body is required to place an advertisement inviting the submission of proposals in a newspaper with a circulation in the locality sufficient to inform the people of the affected locality pursuant to a number of requisite publication and submittal deadlines as noted in the statute. However, a governmental body may shorten or waive the advertising requirement if "in the case of a proposed acquisition (in this case a lease), the governmental body determines in writing that advertising will not benefit the governmental body's interest because of the unique qualities or location of the property needed."

MGL requires that the determination of uniqueness "shall specify the manner in which the property proposed for acquisition satisfies the unique requirements. The governmental body shall publish the determination and the reasons for the determination, along with the names of the parties having a beneficial interest in the property pursuant to section forty J of chapter seven, the location and size of the property, and the proposed purchase price or rental terms, in the central register not less than thirty days before the governmental body executes a binding agreement to acquire the property."

As such, our office has prepared the following motion for this purpose which will comply with the statute. Should the Board vote the motion as prepared, counsel will publish the notice in the Central Register in accordance with Mass. General Law.

Following the conclusion of 30 day Central Register publication period, I will be discussing the actual lease itself with members of the Reservation and will bring said document to the Board for your consideration.

#### **Motion:**

Mr. McGee moved that with regard to the proposed lease by the Town of Duxbury of land owned by the Duxbury Beach Reservation, Inc., consisting of approximately 66 acres and including any improvements thereon, and located at and described as: all the land and interests in the land in the towns of Duxbury and Plymouth called Duxbury Beach owned by the Reservation south of a line running approximately east to west along the northerly edge of the northerly parking area at the east end of Powder Point Bridge and north of the entrance to Gurnet/Saquish, subject to continuation of the Massachusetts Audubon Society migratory shorebird refuge at High Pines, and excluding the land at High Pines now or formerly leased to Patrick J. Cudmore, I move that advertising concerning this lease will not benefit the Town's interests because of the unique qualities or location of the property needed by the Town, such land satisfying the Town's unique requirements in the following manner: the property is located immediately adjacent to, and comprises part of, Duxbury Beach and provides access to the Beach; similar access to the Beach is not possible from other locations as the result of the local geography and environmental limitations in the area; and the parcel provides much needed parking for and access to the beach for members of the public.

## Discussion regarding upcoming Beach Season

Ms. Cris Luttazi, Executive Director of the Duxbury Beach Reservation provided a slide-show update regarding the Beach Management guidelines for the Endangered Species program. She described the legal protection details of the piping plovers and least terns as they are considered threatened and fall under Federal and State Endangered Species Acts. Ms. Luttazi explained in detail the required setbacks for each species from nesting, eggs, and when the chicks hatch. Her presentation also included permitted activities and the permitting process for this recreational beach – especially the ORV access areas. She also provided a comparison of Duxbury Beach and other beaches, such as Sandy Neck and Nauset Beach showing that Duxbury Beach is a significantly narrower length of beach, which limits the driving areas and the nesting areas. She explained in detail our exposures (referred to as "tokens") given it is a recreational beach and also a pathway for resident homes in the Saquish area of Plymouth and the intricate management of our given tokens so that the beach does not get shut down.

Mr. Guitart recognized all of the work Ms. Luttazi and the DBR is doing to maintain access to the beach and encouraged support for DBR and to follow the rules and work together.

Discussion with Alternative Energy Committee Chair, Wendell Cerne, regarding a summary of current projects and to field any questions

Mr. Wendell Cerne, Chair of the Alternative Energy Committee, appeared before the Selectmen to provide an update on what the Committee has been doing and what to do next. He noted that one of the points in Envision Duxbury is to pursue Net Zero carbon – reduction of emissions of fossil fuels. He mentioned that there is a free Webinar on April 12 (link can be found below or on the Duxbury Free Library's calendar) regarding Zero Carbon Home.

Mr. Frank Holden of the Fiscal Advisory Committee stated that the committee was concerned about the role of electric vehicles and solar panels in Town and asked if AEC was working with the DPW, Fire, and Police departments. Mr. Cerne responded that currently they are not, but would be pleased to do that.

Mr. Cerne added that they are looking at next steps to take to come up with a plan. He mentioned that MAPC is helpful and can provide resources.

Mr. Guitart summarized the steps to explore the ability to present a plan for purchasing electricity in bulk and a net zero plan to align with the Commonwealth's goals. He remarked that the Board is in support of the AEC's plans.

There was discussion regarding the availability of grants, and Mr. Cerne mentioned that Barbara Bartlett has been instrumental in locating grants.

Mr. Cerne discussed the following:

#### II. EXPLORATION OF MUNICIPAL/COMMUNITY AGGREGATION

The Commonwealth defines municipal aggregation as "the process by which a municipality (meaning a town or city) purchases electricity in bulk from a competitive supplier on behalf of the residents and businesses within the community." The AEC is researching the option of "Green Community Aggregation" by which, according to the Metropolitan Area Planning Council (MAPC), a municipality chooses to source its electricity in a way that will create demand for new renewable energy to be built, known as additionality, and thereby lower greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions.

#### III.NET ZERO PLAN PROPOSAL

The Commonwealth's Global Warming Solutions Act (GWSA) and subsequent Decarbonization Roadmap calls for net zero carbon emissions by 2050, with interim limits being established for 2025 and 2030. The AEC proposes creating a plan to guide the town's reduction of carbon emissions to align with the Commonwealth's goals.
