- Open Forum. Noted that a comprehensive article on the Commission's efforts to include the Myles Standish Park and homestead site on the National Register of Historic Places appeared in the May 8 edition of the *Duxbury Clipper*.
 A demolition application has yet to be received for the house at 766 Temple Street that was cited
- **2. Minutes.** Minutes of the May 1 meeting were approved by a 4-0 vote.

- 3. Demolition Delay in Effect.
 - a. 308 Summer Street, ca. 1838, total demolition. Delay expires Oct. 6, 2010. Owner Pete DelPrete continues his attempts to find a buyer and seek other alternatives to demolition. Mr.Vose will follow-up on the suggestion to possibly move the structure to the O'Neil Farm property.
- **4. New Demolition Applications:** None received.
- 5. Revisions to the Commissions "Rules and Regulations" and "Applicants Guide."

 A public hearing on proposed revisions to the "Rules and Regulations" is scheduled for June 5; notice of this was not in the May 15 *Duxbury Clipper*, but will appear in the May 22 and May 29 editions.
- **6. New Commissioner Search.** Mr. Vose to contact John Bradford about his interest in serving on the DHC; Mr. Vose will also write a letter to the *Clipper* re: the search for a new commissioner. A search of Talent Bank forms has produced no new candidates.
- **Revisions to Town history on DHC website.** Commissioners are to read this history and bring comments on it to the next meeting.
- **8. CPC Update.** Nothing new to report.
- **9. Local Historic District Update.** Mr. Vose reported CPC funds are not available for survey work of the Town's local historic districts. The LHDC is considering hiring a consultant to conduct research on what homes should be in a LHD.
