This is the inside of my library.




My library has 3 floors and 2 entrances.

These are the times I can visit the library.



The elevator can take me to any floor.


I can use the elevator or stairs on my trip to the library.

These are quiet places in the library.




I can study or read quietly here. This area is on the upper level.

I use my ABCs to find books by looking at the labels on the book's spine in the fiction sections.


These are directional signs.

How many things should I take home today?


These are the computers and iPads.

This is one of the library staff that can help me.




I will hand my library card to the librarian and they will tell me when I have to bring my books or movies back. **16**
