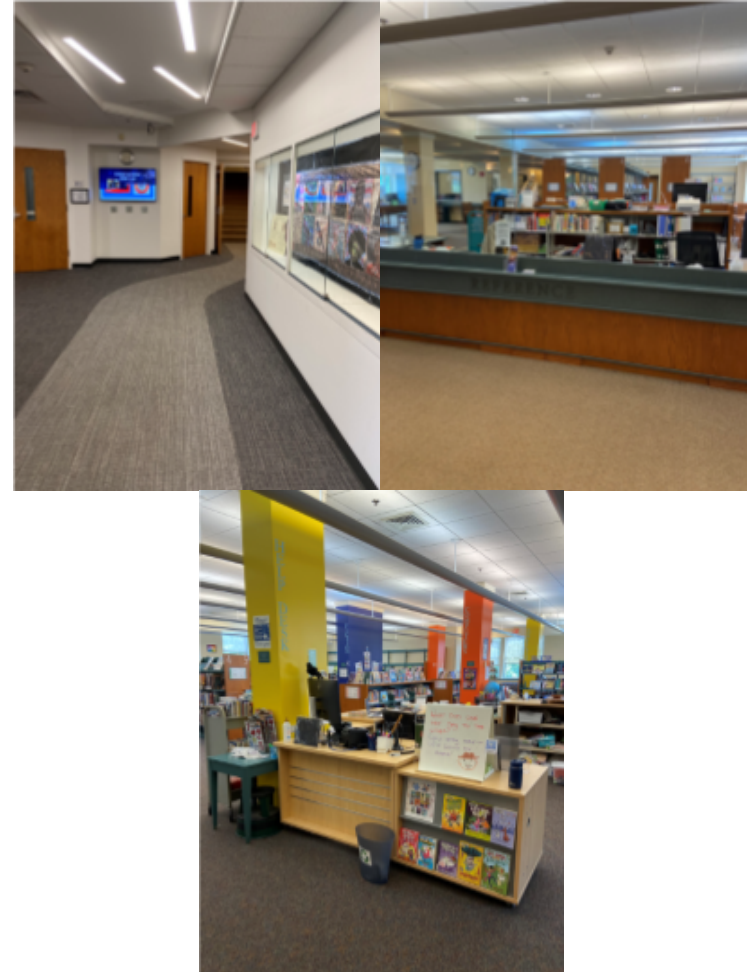


This is the outside of

Wednesday 10:00am-8:00pm

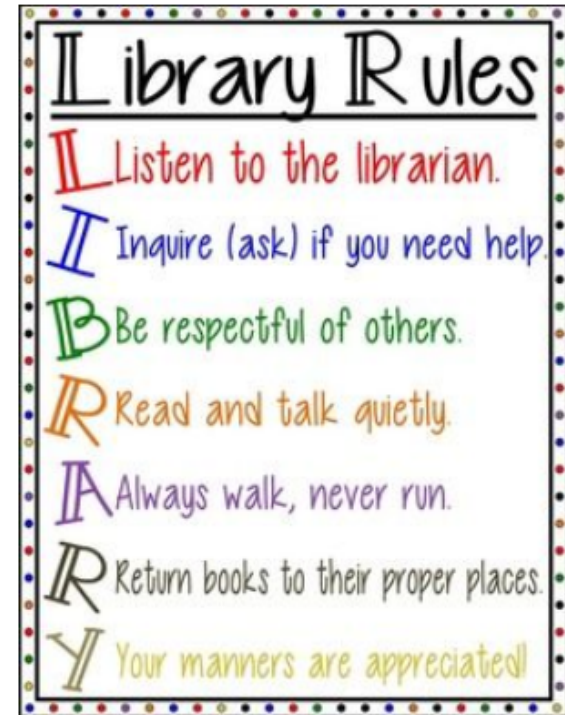
Thursday 10:00am-8:00pm

These are directional signs.



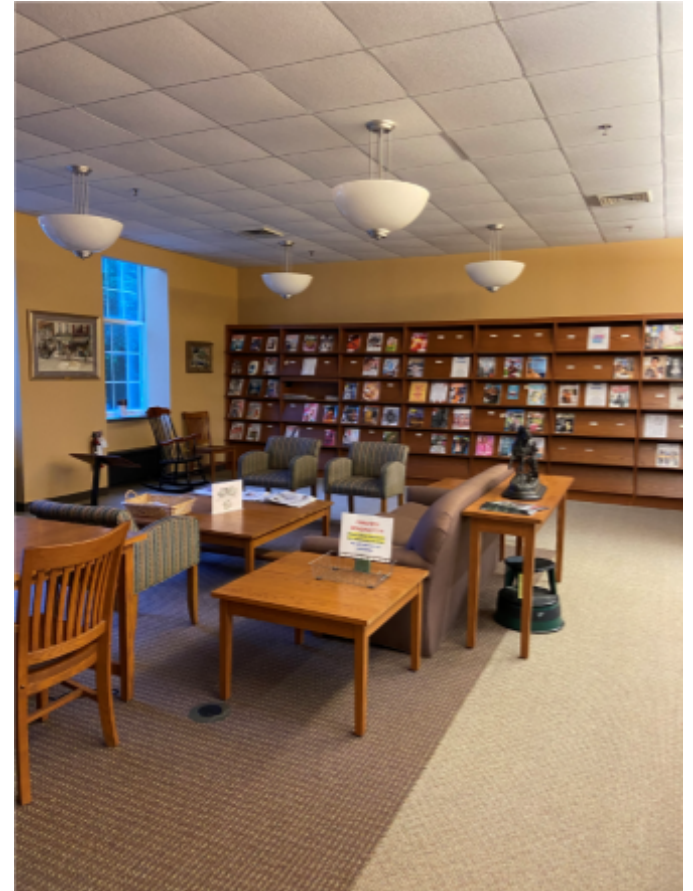
These signs help me find things in the library.

This is the label for non fiction books.



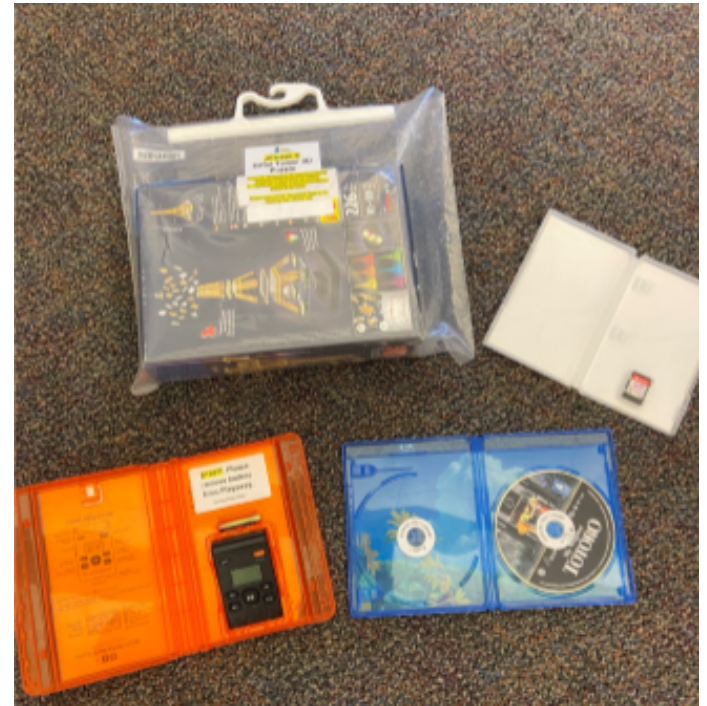
The numbers start at 001 and go to 999.

This is one of the library staff that can help me.



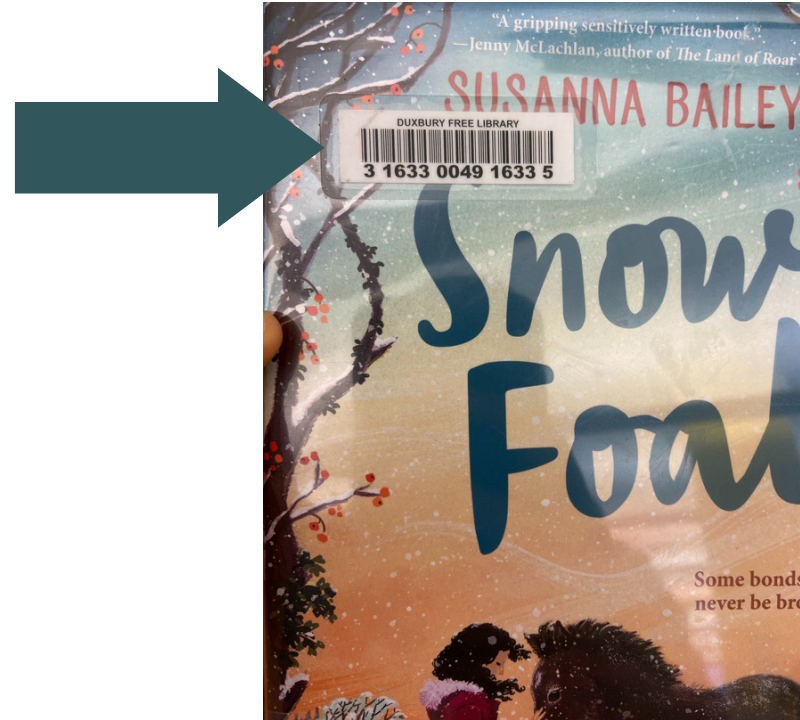
I will hand my library card to the librarian and they will tell me when I have to bring my books or movies back.
