COVID-19 cases in Duxbury *Friday, June 12, 2020*

NOTICE TO THE GENERAL PUBLIC:

The Town of Duxbury has been informed that as of today's date, there have been a total one hundred thirty-one (131) positive cases of COVID-19 in our community. Of these cases, 74 of these individuals have fully recovered and nine (9) of the individuals were tested positive for having the antibodies. Sadly, seven (7) individuals have died as a result of having Coronavirus (COVID-19). Due to privacy requirements, the demographics of these cases will remain anonymous. The close contacts of these positive cases have been notified and are following CDC guidelines for self-quarantine.

This still remains a crucial time in infection control. Maintaining social distancing, limiting exposure to others, avoiding crowded places and vigilant handwashing are vital steps in slowing the spread of this disease.

The Massachusetts Department of Public Health (DPH) continues to work closely with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), other Federal agencies and our local Board of Health to share the most up to date information available.
