1. **Review of NDCAP Meeting -May 22, Monday, 6:30**. ### 2. Pilgrim's Wastewater Disposal Issue-

Jim and I made an updated presentation on the wastewater discharge to the Selectboard April 24. The focus was Holtec's wastewater permits medication application, March 31, 2023. Because the request is for a new discharge, there will be an antidegradation review.

<u>The Selectboard was interested in</u> the classification of Cape Cod Bay and associated embayments; how that factored into the state's review; and what action the town might take.

We said the committee would provide a written response.

We suggested a request to the Commonwealth to designate Cape Cod Bay, and associated embayments, to Outstanding Resource Waters (ORWs), from its current designation High Quality Waters (HQWs). By changing to ORW, the state's antidegradation tier review of Holtec's March 31, 2023, water permit modification request would change to a Tier 2 ½ review from a Tier 2 review. We understand further that Cape Cod Bay is not designated in 314 CMR 400 drainage area maps. Therefore, we would like to know when Cape Cod Bay itself was designated an HQW; by which agency, and the data relied upon for that designation. See maps in Appendix.

To support the request for designating Cape Cod Bay an ORW, we show that Cape Cod Bay, and its associated embayments constitute an outstanding resource as determined by its outstanding socioeconomic, recreational, ecological, or aesthetic value. Also, certain waters within Cape Cod Bay are Areas of Critical Environmental Concern.

A draft will be circulated to the committee for comment. Document links were circulated in April's agenda. Also let's discuss ideas to get others involved.
