\$10 Weekend MBTA Train Passes

(June 9– Sept. 2, 2018 Pilot Program)



From June 9 through September 2 the MBTA will be running a pilot program offering a \$10 pass that allows train riders unlimited trips on Saturdays and Sundays. The special fare will be valid on all zones from the first scheduled Saturday trip through the last scheduled Sunday trip, and apply to riders age 12 and older. Each paying adult will be able to bring two children, 11 and younger, for free.

In other words, a mother, father, and four kids can visit the Children's Museum, Aquarium, Fourth of July festivities, or anything else Boston has to offer for only \$20. This is truly remarkable, since it now costs \$23 for one adult roundtrip from Kingston to Boston.

Inbound trains to Boston leave Kingston on weekends at:

7 AM, 8:50 AM, 10:05 AM, 11:30 AM, 1:22 PM, 3:35 PM, 6:28 PM*, and 9:37 PM.

Outbound trains leave South Station on weekends at:

8:30 AM, 10:05 AM, 11:47 AM*, 2 PM, 4:10 PM, 5:20 PM, 8:20 PM, and 10:45 PM.

The Kingston station is located near the Independence Mall on Marion Drive.

The Halifax commuter rail station is located on Rte. 36 (Holmes Street). The trips take under an hour (45 minutes from Halifax).

*If you choose to ride the 6:28 PM inbound from Kingston, it is recommended that you board at the Halifax station at 7:14 PM instead, since the train backtracks to Plymouth station after leaving Kingston. Likewise, the 11:47 AM outbound from Boston goes to Plymouth first, so it's better to plan your trip from Halifax.

This is a pilot program so ridership during this period might determine whether the MBTA continues it beyond the summer.
