Dear Duxbury Community,

I'm not sure about you, but I can hardly remember the summer of 2019. What I do recall is that we had settled into our beautiful new addition, our programs and services were booming, the parking lot was filled, and our volunteers were engaged! The accreditation committee was completing the work for our third National Accreditation, and we were getting ready to submit our binder to the National Institute of Senior Centers for review.

Then, in March of 2020 COVID hit.

We pivoted our services, updated policies and procedures to keep our patrons and staff safe, and we continued meeting the needs of the older adults in the community.

I want to thank our dedicated staff, COA Board, Friends of the COA, and our patrons for having faith in us, for attending programs virtually, for believing in us as we changed the way we offered services, for saying thank you and letting us know how much you appreciate the work we are doing.

It's been a hard year, but the most rewarding year that I have had during my tenure at the Senior Center. The doors of the Senior Center closed on Thursday, March 12, 2020, and the following Monday we were back at work, preparing and delivering meals to the homebound. By the end of that same week, we had purchased a Zoom account and learned a "new language." Every day, we were making calls to older adults, just to check in and see how they were doing.

By late spring, we added Grab & Go meals to our repertoire. It was wonderful to see friends as they picked up meals. In summer, we enjoyed programs on the patio. We also began providing transportation with new COVID guidelines. In September, our Social Day Program for adults living with Alzheimer's disease was back in the building. It was wonderful to hear the laughter of friends being together. In October, we added the Peapod Program to our on-site offerings. Both programs followed extensive safety procedures.

Once the vaccine was released, we partnered with Skin Esteem Med Spa, OSCO Drug, and the Town of Duxbury to provide vaccines to community members. I want to say a special thank you to the staff, family members, and volunteers who helped us book vaccine appointments, volunteered at the clinics, and made the whole vaccine process easy.

As we phase-in programs and services on site and continue to connect via Zoom, I am pleased to say participation in our programs is growing. The future will be different than we once thought, but the staff and I look forward to finding creative solutions to any challenges the future may bring.

Major Board Accomplishments

The Duxbury Senior Center was unanimously approved by the Accreditation Board of the National Institute of Senior Centers in October 2020. The Board worked with staff and members of the community to navigate this process, which included nine separate sub committees.

The Accreditation is an important distinction and demonstrates the Center's outstanding leadership and commitment to quality programs and services. The Accreditation lasts for a period of five years. This is the third time the Center has earned this honor. Out of the 15,000 senior centers in the county, only 264 have completed the rigorous process to be accredited. Only 143 have been accredited once, 83 have been accredited twice and only 41 of the 15,000 centers have been accredited three times.

Each committee working on the accreditation received a copy of the newly updated Long Range Plan, which was another Board initiative. This document served as the framework to guide committees while completing their work. The committees included:



Dear Joanne,

I am pleased to officially inform you that the Accreditation Board met on October 29, 2020 and unanimously approved the recommendation for accreditation of the Duxbury Senior Center. Successfully achieving accreditation status takes the work of many people both in the senior center and in the community. When these two groups work together the rewards will be felt for many years to come. Your organization demonstrates outstanding leadership and commitment to quality programs and services. This letter is your official notification that the Duxbury Senior Center has been accredited by NCOA/NISC for a period of five years (October 2020- October 2025).

Your Peer Reviewer observed many strengths of the Duxbury Senior Center. These included:

- Amazing leadership and a very strong staff.
- Exemplary Board engagement and involvement in the Center.
- A strong and diverse funding base with a major ongoing commitment from the town.
- An impressive self-assessment exercise process with 33 participants that obviously opened eyes and understanding both about the challenges and opportunities for the center.
- This process also birthed important projects such as a very impressive and attractive
 annual report, an ongoing commitment to strengthening evaluation, and the creation of
 a long-range planning committee that is already engaged.
- The creation of an ambitious action plan detailing tasks, responsibilities and timelines.
- The strong support both financially and in furthering the mission by the Friends group.
- An excellent, wide-ranging array of programs, and services including a number of evidence-based programs that effectively measure positive benefits and outcomes.
- The Adult Daycare program in the center that is evidence of a commitment to reach out to impaired and struggling seniors.
- A beautiful center recently enhanced by a 4000 SF addition that also hosts a number of meetings by community groups.
- A large core of committed volunteers, including a model self-directed team planning and carrying out lifelong learning programming.
- A willingness to tackle change, for example, by recruiting a focus group to address the interests and attract Boomers and younger generations.
- A strong community service and outreach effort that also addresses different populations such as LGBTQ seniors.

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Pandamic 2020

Although our doors were closed on March 12, 2020, we never missed a day of providing services to Duxbury seniors. Our Home Delivered Meals increased by 40%. We offered **over 1,009 Zoom programs with 11,739 participants** and **served 623 Grab & Go lunches** to connect with seniors. By September 2020 we welcomed back our **Social Day Program** using new Covid-safety procedures and guidelines. In October we launched the PeaPods program for seniors who were identified as lonely and isolated. Best of all, working with the Town of Duxbury, Osco Drug, and Skin Esteem in Kingston, beginning in February of 2021, we were able to make over **1,485 vaccinations appointments** for members of our community.







During this challenging time, we are committed to ensuring that the older adults in our community remain safe and have the resources they need. We are working with the Town management and emergency personnel on a daily basis to do what we can to keep our friends and neighbors in Duxbury safe. The building is closed, but staff members are available to answer questions and address concerns. We are still providing Home Delivered Meals and information and referral services. We have canceled our transportation services, but if there is a critical need, call us and we can try to provide a solution. All of our calls are going through one number, and we will check it daily. Highlights for Fiscal 2020

2020 is a year we will always remember!

I want to thank the entire Senior Center staff for their hard work, creativity, and commitment to the older adults of Duxbury. I am honored to work with such a dedicated and caring group. When we closed our doors on March 12th, due to the Coronavirus, the team created policies and procedures to implement programs and services safely. Each month, the staff at the Senior Center implemented new programs and partnered with community organizations to make a difference in the lives of the people we serve.

In July of 2019, we hosted the ribbon cutting ceremony for the new 4,160 square foot addition to our facility. We want to thank the Town of Duxbury for their support and the Friends of the COA for purchasing all the new furnishings for the addition as well as the state of the art technology that is available in every room.

During the summer months, we hosted a variety of programs including The Annual Hydrangea Festival, Pages in History and summer school for our lifelong learners.

In September, 370 adults enrolled in one of the 15 courses offered through our Lifelong Learning program.

We also revamped our food service program to meet the needs of the older adults in the community.

In October, we collaborated with Collette Travel to expand our travel options to include overnight travel. We also made additional appointments with our SHINE Counselors to assist older adults in making good decisions regarding their health insurance during Open Enrollment.

In November, we hosted a Successful Downsizing Program, two Booked for Lunch Programs in partnership with the Duxbury Free Library, local restaurants, and Booked!, our local pop-up book store. We offered three Senior Safety programs on "How to Use Uber and Lyft," "How to Hire a Home Improvement Contractor," and offered "AARP's Older Wiser Driver Program."

In December, we hosted a variety of holiday events including a Holiday Read, Sing, Play in partnership with the Duxbury Free Library, craft time with a local Brownie Troop, and a Holiday White Elephant Sale. We also worked with the Duxbury High School students from the Bread Board, and Jazz Trio in curating an Art Show with Liz Haywood Sullivan and a New Year's Eve event in partnership with the Duxbury Rotary Club.

During January, the Board, Friends and staff hosted the ninth Annual Black Tie Bingo event, which raised \$16,300 for the Interfaith Council to help the community stay warm. We kicked off our LGBT Initiative with a Meet in Greet and thanks to a grant from the Grafton Foundation,

we began planning a Memoir Writing Program that would be implemented in spring.



In February, 231 adults came out in the cold to register for our Lifelong Learning Program. We began the semester with thirteen programs, eight were put on hold due to the pandemic and five continued via Zoom. We also provided space for AARP Tax volunteers to provide free tax return services, offered Heart Connections with the Boston Buddha and had the pleasure of working with former librarian Nancy Denman, Energy Medicine Practitioner to offer Reboot your Body's Energy.

On March 12th, we closed our building due to Coronavirus but adapted our programs and services to meet













the needs of the community. Our Home Delivered Meals program increased by 40%, our fitness, education, Lifelong Learning and recreational programming went virtual. Our staff made wellness calls to people, 70+ weekly. We are so thankful to the Duxbury Rotary, Duxbury Interfaith Council, and a local family for donated grocery and pharmacy gift cards. This enabled us to shop for people when they were uncomfortable leaving their home.

In April, we began taping Kay Talks on PAC TV. This show provided important health and wellness information for viewers. We implemented a virtual fitness schedule including four Balance for Life classes led by Sarah Roberts and a Yoga class led by Kim O'Brien. We offered Zoom socials as a way to see people and introduce participants to Zoom. We moved our Booked for Lunch, Senior Safety Series, and Duxbury Women's Series to a virtual format as well.



In May, we continued a series on South Shore's Natural History, a series funded by a grant from the Duxbury Cultural Council and we hosted our annual Volunteer Appreciation with a drive through event. It was so nice to see our volunteers and thank them for their service with a Grab & Go lunch.

In June, we hosted a LGBT Pride Event on Zoom, and worked in partnership with PACTV, the Plymouth Center for Active Living, Kingston COA and Pembroke COA to create a "PACTV Guide". This guide provides older adults the opportunity to partake in exercise, entertainment, educational speakers without the need for technology. We also











piloted our first virtual evidence based program, UCLA's Memory Training.

No one could have predicted what the last four months of the fiscal year would look like. Our goal is always to stay connected to the community—and through this pandemic; we have been successful in achieving that goal. We made wellness checks, birthday calls, provided updates on Facebook and Twitter, curated virtual programming, Home Delivered Meals to community members and organized several Grab & Go meal events.

We look forward to opening our doors again, seeing the people we care about in person and meeting the needs of the older adults in whatever way makes them feel comfortable.
