COMMUNITY SERVICES

How do I dispose of needles or lancets (such as used with diabetic persons or animals)? Sharps (ex. insulin needles, lancets, etc.) are essential to the ongoing at-home care of many people and pets. Once these items are used, it is unsafe to just throw them in the trash. Sharps collection is offered at the **Duxbury Fire Station**, free of charge during normal business hours. Sharps must be delivered in a clearly marked, sealed, hard plastic container.

Do you need to dispose of medication? The Prescription Drug Drop Box is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and is located in the main lobby of the **Duxbury Police Station.** The Prescription Drug Drop Box does not accept liquids or needles. Please drop off needles to the Duxbury Fire Department and contact the Duxbury Health Department to dispose of liquids.

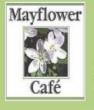
Q. Competitive Bocce player and DSC Bowling League Maven - Have you always been a sports enthusiast?

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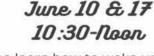

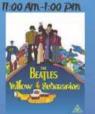

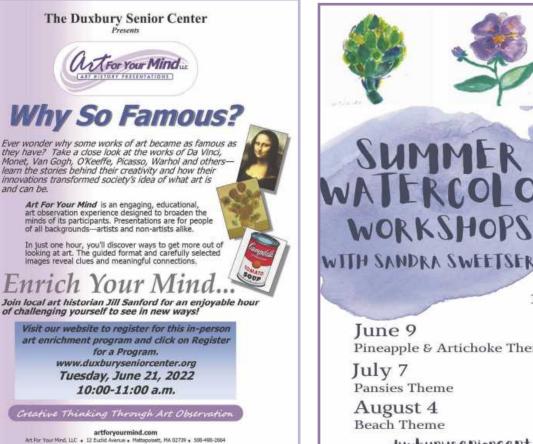

Veterans News June, 2022

I wanted to remind all Veterans who fly the United States flag that on Memorial Day our flag is at half staff at sunrise and raised to full staff at noon. This is the only day that our flag flies at half staff unless ordered by the President or Governor. For those Veterans in Duxbury, you are

welcome to join the Memorial Day parade honoring those who gave their lives and those who have served in the United States military. The parade is on Memorial Day, May 30th and leaves from Myles Standish cemetery at 1000. I will be proud to carry the Ukrainian flag in the parade.

Fraud aimed at Veterans is on the increase. Communication by phone, mail or email by supposed government personnel or agencies may not be legitimate and are of concern. Do not respond unless you confirm there are legit. Most legitimate communication is by mail but you still need to confirm.

Duxbury American Legion Post 223 has bottle and can duty at the town transfer station in the months of May and July. If you have any bottles or cans that are redemption eligible please drop them off. Money goes toward student scholarships.

If you have a current VA disability rating and new medical evidence about the disability comes forth and you think this new evidence can impact the rating, then you should consider submitting a supplemental claim, VA form 20-0995. You also should submit in the same mailing the clinical evidence from your primary care doctor on what the new evidence is and how you are impacted. This review process by the VA may take up to 4-5 months.

I continue to receive very positive comments from Veterans who receive care from Boston VA Healthcare System. This includes the outpatient facility in Plymouth and VA Brockton. We are fortunate to have this quality of care for those eligible.

Last month in this news, I listed the respiratory medical conditions that have been designated to be presumptive and are VA claim eligible. Your service location is key. You must have served in Afghanistan, Djibouti, Syria or Uzbekistan during the Persian Gulf War, starting September, 19 2001 to present. Also areas in Southwest Asia, beginning August 2, 1990 to present, to include Iraq, Kuwait, Saudi Arabia, the neutral zone between Iraq and Saudi Arabia, Bahrain, Qatar, the United Arab Emirates, Oman, the Gulf of Oman, the Persian Gulf, the Arabian Sea, the Red Sea and the airspace above these locations. If you have questions about your military service, please contact the **Duxbury Veterans Service officer located at the Senior Center**, **781-934-5774 x 5740.**
