RENTALS—LIQUOR LICENSE POLICY(For Non-Profit Fundraising Only)

If a non-profit group is interested in obtaining a liquor license, the following steps must be taken.

- 1. The non-profit organization must apply for a one-day liquor license through the Selectmen's Office (no charge).
- 2. The organization requesting the liquor license must obtain at least \$1 million insurance for general liability (use of Town property) AND the organization requesting the liquor license must obtain at least a \$1 million liquor liability insurance policy. (If a private catering company is organizing the event, they must have liquor liability insurance for their business so groups hiring them do not need to buy additional insurance.)
- 3. The Selectmen's Office must receive certificates of insurance for both general and liquor liability insurance prior to the event.
- 4. All bartenders working at the event must be TIPPS certified.
- The Board of Selectmen must review all requests after obtaining Police, Fire and Inspectional Services approval. Only then will a license be issued.

Holding an event without one can have serious legal consequences for the individual(s) involved.

The process can take 3 to 4 weeks!!!

If you are considering holding an event in which alcohol will be served, it is important to visit the Selectmen's Office immediately to obtain the proper documentation. **Note: only Non-profit fundraising organizations can apply for a Liquor License at the DSC.**)
