



Camp Wing Conservation Area

Early settlers designated this area as common land for woodcutting, hunting, and fishing. The land was purchased from Crossroads for Kids, Inc. in 1998. Currently, Crossroads, Inc., a non-profit organization serving local and inner-city youth, owns the 157 acre Camp Wing on Keene Street. Over two miles of the South River, which flows to Massachusetts Bay, are now protected.

Property Details: 450 acres

Franklin Street: 2.7 miles of trails: Blue Loop: 0.6 miles, Orange Loop: 0.2 miles, Red: 0.2 miles, Yellow: 1.3 miles
 Temple Street: Blue Loop: 0.6 miles

Vegetation: Upland mixed forest, freshwater marsh, red maple swamp

Features: Several rare and uncommon plants and animals; River frontage; Granite remains of the Keene's Sawmill foundation, used for the production of cranberry boxes; South River

Terrain: Easy-Moderate - Relatively flat main trails with some hills

Parking: Lots located on Franklin and Temple Streets
 Roadside parking along North Street
