

## **Camp Wing Conservation Area**

Early settlers designated this area as common land for woodcutting, hunting, and fishing. The land was purchased from Crossroads for Kids, Inc. in 1998. Currently, Crossroads, Inc., a non-profit organization serving local and inner-city youth, owns the 157 acre Camp Wing on Keene Street. Over two miles of the South River, which flows to Massachusetts Bay, are now protected.

**Property Details:** 450 acres

Franklin Street: 2.7 miles of trails: Blue Loop: 0.6 miles, Orange Loop: 0.2 miles, Red: 0.2 miles, Yellow: 1.3 miles Temple Street: Blue Loop: 0.6 miles

**Vegetation:** Upland mixed forest, freshwater marsh, red maple swamp

**Features:** Several rare and uncommon plants and animals; River frontage; Granite remains of the Keene's Sawmill foundation, used for the production of cranberry boxes; South River

**Terrain:** Easy-Moderate - Relatively flat main trails with some hills

**Parking:** Lots located on Franklin and Temple Streets Roadside parking along North Street
