

Drugs: Dealer Focused Approach

- ~ Enhance Tip System
- ~ Deploy Interdiction Team
- ~ Investigate Aggressively
- ~ Consistent Enforcement of Civil Marijuana Law

Alcohol: Source Reduction & Deterrence

- Liquor Store Compliance
- Social Hosting Enforcement
- ~ Open Container Bylaw
- ~ New Bylaw Proposal (Article 14 ATM)



Proposed By-Law...A new tool

- Civil option
- No permanent court record
- State Law still available when appropriate
- Discretion / common sense policing
- Consistent application of consequences

- Criminal Complaint
- Permanent Probation Record
- Driver's License Suspension
- Arrestable Offense

- Civil Noncriminal
- No Permanent Court Record
- •No Action on Driver's License
- No Right of Arrest
